Introduction

The two year subspecialty residency training program in Nephrology is designed to develop clinical and laboratory skills and expertise in the diagnosis and management of acute and chronic renal disease, fluid and electrolyte disturbances, and the treatment of hypertension.

Education Program

The subspecialty program will be jointly sponsored by St. John Macomb-Oakland Hospital an acute care 376-bed community hospital and Botsford General Hospital an acute care 330-bed community hospital which are approved by the American Osteopathic Association for intern and residency training, as well as multiple subspecialty training programs. The sponsoring hospitals have full services in medicine, urology, surgery, pediatrics, pathology, radiology, emergency medicine, anesthesia, obstetrics and gynecology, orthopedics and multiple subspecialties in medicine and surgery.

The Nephrology training sites include acute care within both hospitals and chronic dialysis services at the botsford kidney center and nephrology and hemodialysis services at seven sites in the Detroit Metro area. Access to a renal transplantation program will provide experiences in pre and post transplant patient care. Electives will also be available to the residents.

At the conclusion of the training period, the resident will have mastered all the necessary skills for the clinical practices of nephrology.
