"Just Delicious" Chocolate Raviolis

1 cup good quality milk chocolate
1/2 cup white chocolate chips
1/2 tsp vegetable oil

Microwave in glass bowl for 1 minute. Stir until smooth. Spread evenly on wax paper in a rectangle shape. Repeat. Spoon 1/2 tsp. hazelnut filling 1" apart-2 rows. Lay second sheet of chocolate on top. Put back in refrigerator until set but not hard. Score with scalloped cutter. Return to refrigerator until hard. Carefully break apart. Melt white chocolate and oil in microwave for 1 minute. Stir until smooth. Drizzle over raviolis. **RM**

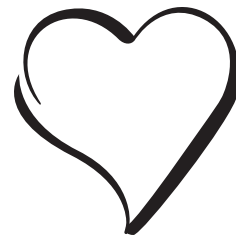
